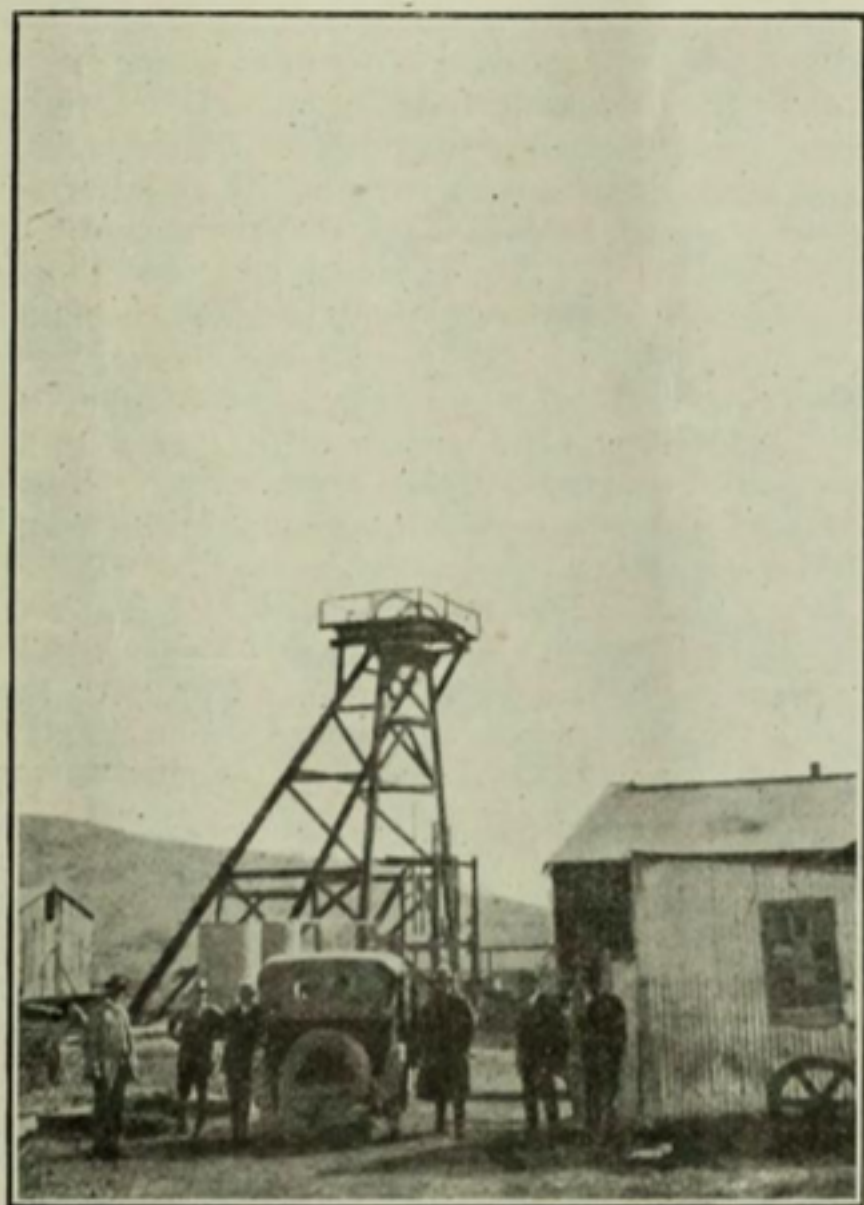


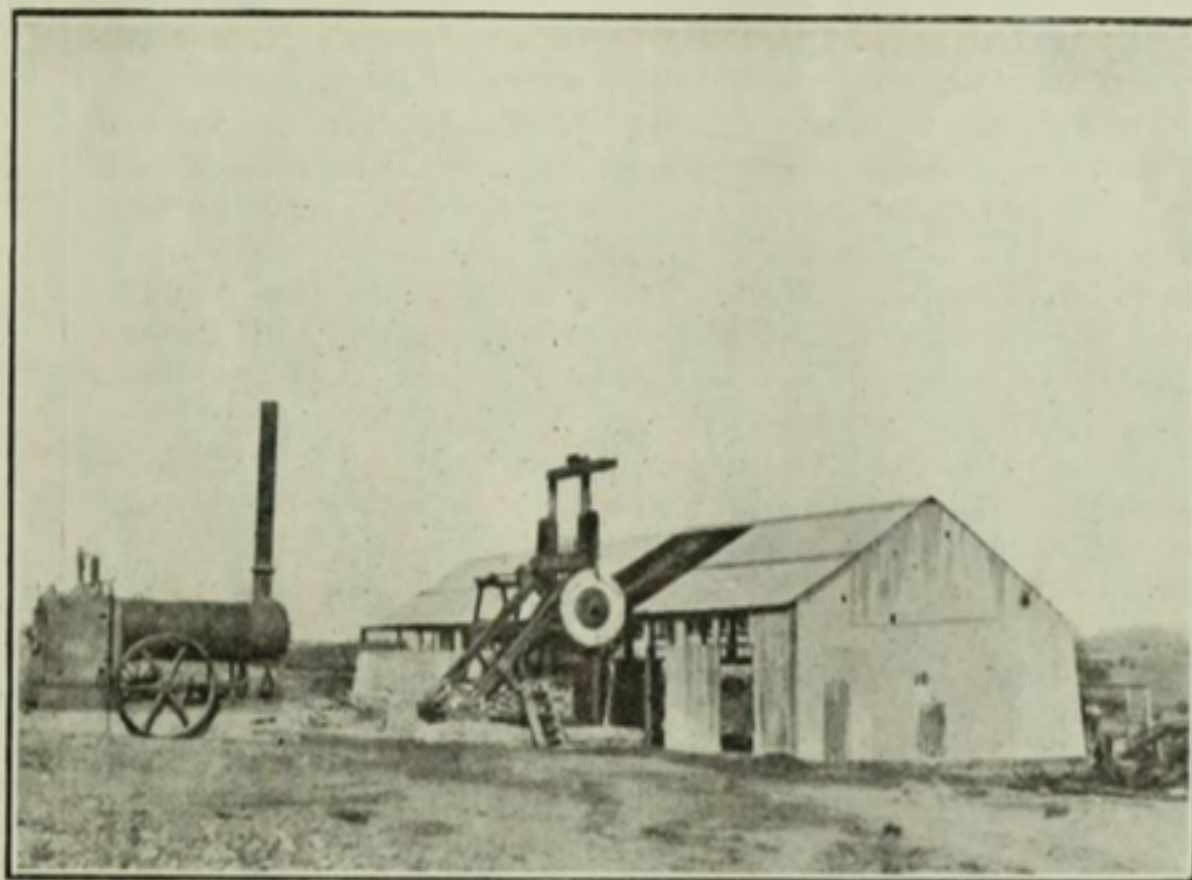
The Forth-coming Edendale Silver & Lead Flotation

THE next silver and lead flotation is to be that of the **Edendale mine** in the Pretoria district. The mine has been worked for many years but, like its neighbours, it suffered from the low prices prevailing a few years ago for silver and lead. A lot of money has been spent in the development of the mine, and two shafts have been put down on the strike of the lode. The property is equipped with a

useful five-stamp mill (shown in one of the illustrations), and milling will begin next week. The records of the mine contain highly favourable reports made upon it from time to time in the past by such well-known engineers as Messrs. J. I. Hoffman, David Draper, J. M. Calderwood, and Broad Roberts. With silver and lead at their present prices all the flattering things said about the property by these engineers should be more than realised.
